Court Experiment on Electronic Briefs

As part of an experiment to gain experience with electronic case filings, the Court will accept the submission of briefs in electronic format. In order to do this, all parties to a case must agree. It is important to note that such a submission does not in any way replace or reduce the required number of paper briefs submitted, nor does this submission in any other way change the rules of the Court.

Briefs may be submitted on CD-ROM, in a form readable by a PC. If the CD-ROM is created on a Macintosh system, the CD_ROM must be created as a “hybrid disk”, readable by both Mac and PC. The briefs must be in Portable Document Format (*.pdf) file format, and the media must be scanned for viruses before being submitted. Only one brief may be included on a CD-ROM. Only one CD-ROM per brief is necessary. If the parties agree, excerpts of record may also be submitted in electronic format.

The following convention for naming the file must be followed:

Docket Number, Party Filing Brief, Date, Name of Counsel

For Example: *99-12345.Appellant's Opening Brief. 05152001.John Smith*
