Subject Matter: Appeal of district court's denial of motions to dismiss action seeking to recover from a Spanish museum a painting allegedly taken in 1939 in violation of international law by an agent of the government of Nazi Germany.

Holding: The court lacks appellate jurisdiction over district court's decision declining to dismiss the action for lack of personal jurisdiction and a case or controversy. Lawsuit falls within the "expropriation" exception to sovereign immunity under the Foreign Sovereign Immunities Act, 28 U.S.C. § 1605(a)(3). Spain and the Thyssen-Bornemisza Collection Foundation are not immune simply because neither was the taker. Section 1605(a)(3) does not mandate exhaustion of remedies (in Germany or Spain) before a court may determine whether subject matter jurisdiction exists.

Holding: The Arizona Court of Appeals unreasonably concluded that *Miranda* advisements made to defendant were clear and understandable. The state court made an unreasonable determination that defendant voluntarily confessed, and unreasonably applied clearly established federal law in failing to consider the totality of the circumstances to determine whether defendant's will was overborne by the interrogation. The coerced confession was inadmissible and the error was not harmless.

The en banc court affirmed the district court's conclusion that the California Supreme Court was objectively unreasonable in summarily denying petitioner's claim of ineffective assistance at sentencing, based on counsel's prejudicial failure to investigate, discover and introduce readily available mitigation evidence.
