from an immigration judge's decision denying his application for cancellation of removal. We have jurisdiction under 8 U.S.C. § 1252. We review factual determinations for substantial evidence, *Moran v. Ashcroft*, 395 F.3d 1089, 1091 (9th Cir. 2005), and we deny the petition for review.

Substantial evidence supports the agency's determination that Andrade Ochoa lacks good moral character under 8 U.S.C. § 1101(f)(6) because he denied that he had more than one conviction before an asylum officer. *See Ramos v. INS*, 246 F.3d 1264, 1266 (9th Cir. 2001).
